Plans for emergency evacuation

The PCC have been reviewing the action we might take in the case of a fire. We are planning to have a practice using old fire extinguishers in the autumn. This will be open to all.

We are also checking the best emergency evacuation for anyone who might have a particular difficulty such as severe asthma that might be triggered by smoke, reduced mobility etc. If you think you might need a personal emergency evacuation plan please have a chat with Tina or Caroline.

EcoTip for August: Looking after wildlife in the heat. Times of drought and dryness can be dangerous for wildlife. Provide water for birds and insects - put a dish of water out to help wildlife stay hydrated. Insects, small mammals, birds, and even badgers, foxes, and deer could benefit. A stone in a plant saucer helps bees to perch and drink without drowning. These small actions make a big difference and are just some of the ways we can live out our calling to care for God's creation. Chutney and jam: Help needed!

Chutney (in particular) and jam sell extremely well at our fayres, alongside the famous St Guthlac's marmalade, and raise a significant sum of money.

Large quantities are contributed by a small group of people, some of whom will not be able to make so much this year due to not having so much surplus fruit and vegetables. Therefore, we are encouraging those who have fruit trees or vegetable patches, or whose neighbours, friend or relatives have spare produce on offer, to have a go at making a batch of chutney or jam, to help meet the demand at the Christmas Fayre.

Easy recipes are widely available for just about any fruit or vegetable and no special skill or equipment is required, but if you don't have a large enough pan, Lesley has a preserving pan to lend. Jars are available from the welcome area.

Please store your chutney at home in a cool place and let Lesley know nearer the time how many jars you have made so that fabric toppers can be provided.

Please label your jars and also make a note of all your ingredients to accompany your jars to the fayre so that buyers can be advised of any allergens.

Please do have a go! Your help would be much appreciated. Thank you.

We also have a few plastic kneelers available for upcycling. Please speak to Lesley if you would like any.

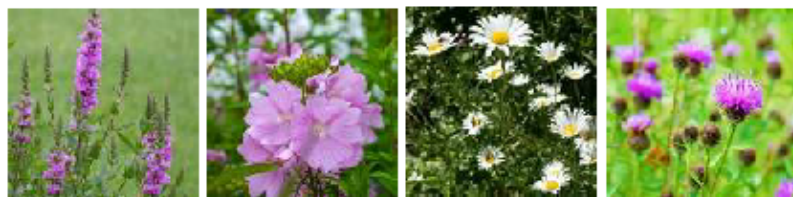
News from St Guthlac's garden

It has been lovely to see local people sitting and enjoying our pretty garden throughout the year, and the Village on The Street community group was really appreciative of being able to use our grounds for their very successful summer evening get together.

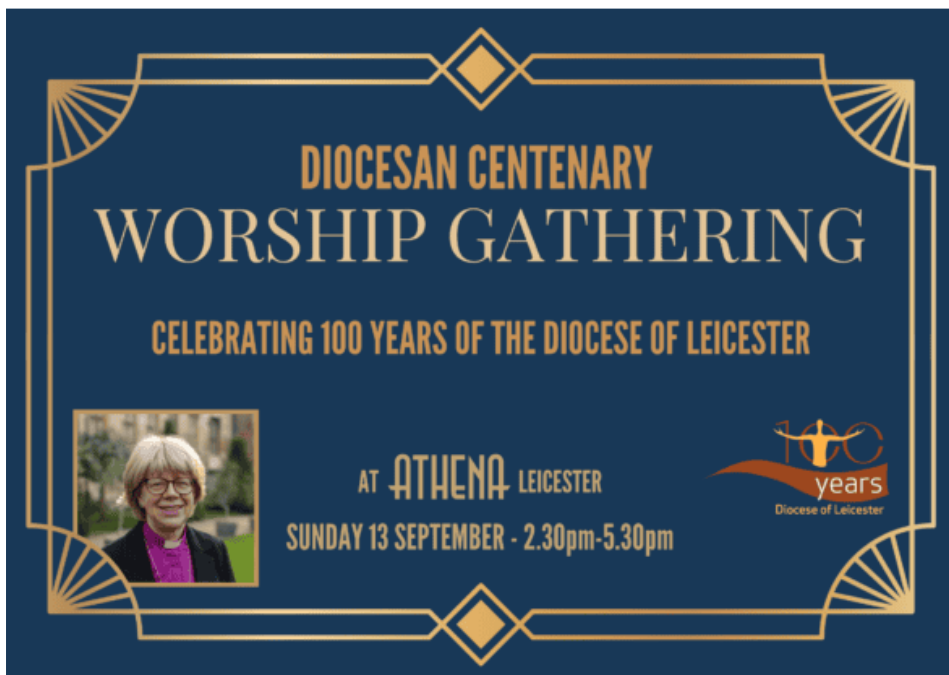
Despite the drought and succession of heatwaves, most of our trees, shrubs and smaller plants have survived. We have kept water use to a minimum, but thanks are due to those who have regularly kept an eye on, and watered, the most recently planted things, and also to those adding appropriate waste to the compost bin.

The meadow area has now been cut. Earlier in the year it was lovely to see the snowdrops which have been introduced around the apple tree. Various seeds and plug plants have been put in this area, so we are hoping some of them will become established in due course.

The policy of introducing more wild flowers into the garden has been successful (although it has proved very difficult to get anything to grow under the yew tree). We now have Purple Loosestrife, Foxgloves, Mallow, Common Knapweed, Oxeye Daisy and more.
